COMMUNITY SERVICE BOOKS / REPORTS

THERE WILL BE NO JUDGING OF COMMUNITY SERVICE BOOKS/REPORTS ON THE NATIONAL LEVEL; however, competition at the State level is at each state's option. In 2025, Kansas will not have judging but will present each Community Grange, submitting a book/report to the State CS Director, with a monetary award at the Kansas State Grange Convention Annual Banquet in September. Each Grange will also receive a certificate from National Grange at that time.

Reports/books are to be postmarked on or before August 15, 2025 and mailed to Randee Farmer, 1210 State Street, Augusta, KS 67010. Effective this year, the option to scan and email a report (2 pages) instead of mailing a book is acceptable – email to farmermd13@cox.net on or before August 15, 2025.

Books/reports will be displayed at State Grange Convention for viewing by Grangers and non-Grangers alike. All will be returned to Granges at end of convention. (National will give a monetary award to a State Grange if 25% of their Community Granges participate in Community Service so your year-end submittals to the State CS Director are important.)

FIREFIGHTER/EMT / LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER / TEACHER OF THE YEAR

THERE WILL NO LONGER BE JUDGING OF NOMINATIONS ON THE NATIONAL LEVEL; however, honoring and celebrating hometown heroes (someone who goes above and beyond the duties of their profession and betters the community) is encouraged on the local and State levels. Kansas will continue to recognize one

Firefighter/EMT, Law Enforcement Officer, and/or Teacher of the Year on the State level.

KANSAS STATE GRANGE STATE COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECT C.A.R.D.S.

(Caring About ouR Deployed Servicepersons)

OBJECTIVE: To create handmade greeting cards for deployed military personnel to use for writing home to relatives and friends. The front of the card is decorated; the inside of card is blank, allowing space for writing. (Glitter cannot be used for safety reasons; colored paper must be light enough in color to allow writing to show.)

BACKGROUND: C.A.R.D.S. was launched 9/11/10 at the Augusta United Methodist Church, Augusta, KS, by an inspired lady with a passion for helping the military. She got her idea from a group called Operation/WriteHome. Her inspiration has led to the sending of hundreds of cards a month to servicepersons all over the world. She had owned a scrapbooking store at one time, so has unselfishly given of her surplus supplies, tools, and ideas. C.A.R.D.S. gets additional donations of supplies (cardstock, paper, envelopes, decorations, glue, etc) and postage monies from those interested in the project. The group meets once a month for a C.A.R.D.S. Party to assemble kits (all the pieces necessary to make a card are put in baggies, ready to be assembled by others interested in helping) and/or make cards.

THIS IS WHERE THE GRANGE CAN HELP: C.A.R.D.S. would like your Grange to help make cards. Intent is to send your Grange kits (including everything you need to make the cards, simply follow the sample provided.) Only cost to your Grange is the return postage to send completed cards back.

IDEAS:

Meals

 Feeding people is an overwhelming passion for Grangers. Ideas include supporting food banks, creating food baskets for community distribution, hosting dinners or preparing full meals for various events and needs, and collecting for food pantries or food drives.

■ Life Skills/Self-Sustainability

 Grangers can teach classes and workshops in cooking, sewing, quilting, painting, carpentry, animal husbandry, defensive driving, pie making, crocheting, dancing, archery, and gardening, among many others. You can also consider holding debates to teach younger generations speaking skills.

■ Community Support

Granges adopt and clean highways, streams, parks, and cemeteries, donate the use of their Halls for community events, support various community projects, serve as an information hub for their towns on bulletin boards and social media, and host legislative forums and debates for candidates for various local positions.

Veterans

Grangers can write cards, make holiday stockings, adopt soldiers and send care packages, host appreciation dinners, honor veterans with Quilts of Valor, and lay wreaths and flags in cemeteries for the holidays. In addition, you can clean cemeteries, and bake cookies or other goodies for the military and VFWs.
